Feature Film (70mm, 35mm and 16mm) coproduction

The Chinese government has informed the government of Canada that Chinese production companies, public and private, may coproduce feature films (70mm, 35mm and 16mm) with foreign partners. However, to be eligible, companies must form a partnership with one of the 35 Chinese public companies authorised to coproduce with foreign countries.
